#### Advent - a Season of Preparation

During the time of Advent, we prepare for the season of Christmas.

During our Time of Transition at Immanuel Lutheran Church, we prepare to call a new pastor. In the meantime, the Rocky Mountain Synod found a Bridge Pastor to help us while we wait!

Pastor William "Bill" Embree has filled in as pulpit supply several times and will begin as our Bridge Pastor on December 7.

Pastor Bill was born in Pasadena, California and grew up near San Diego. He attended seminary at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, California and completed an internship on Long Island, New York. He and his younger brother, John, were both ordained in 1974. His first call was split between Christ Lutheran Church in Downey, California and the Los Angeles Student Ministry Board. He has served at churches in rural northwestern New Jersey, metropolitan Orange County, San Francisco, suburban Vallejo and Salinas (all in California). He also served in Exira and Titonka, Iowa.

Pastor Bill's wife, Carlene, is a retired nurse. Carlene was born and raised in Valley, Nebraska, near Omaha. Over several years, Carlene made many trips to Tanzania with church and private sector organizations to do medical work. Pastor Bill and Carlene have five children, 13 grandchildren, and 7 great-grandchildren. Pastor Bill and Carlene initially retired to Vallejo, California. Their grandson, Wisdom, was born in Denver in 2018. Pastor Bill and Carlene adopted Wisdom when he was 14 months old. They moved to Aurora in February of 2024 to be near Wisdom's Godparents who played a significant role in his beginning of life.

The Council met with Pastor Bill on November  $2^{nd}$  to discuss the possibility of having him be our Bridge Pastor. We met again with him at our November 11 meeting and approved hiring him for the position. We look forward to his assistance with our ministry over the next several months.

The Council has approved hiring Pastor William "Bill" Embree to serve as a Bridge Pastor (see cover page article for more information).

The Call Committee has completed all the necessary paperwork and is waiting to receive names of potential candidates.

Our Rocky Mountain Synod liaison, Pastor Sara Wirth, presented the possibility of an alternative way to call a pastor. It is known as TEEM (Theological Education for Emerging Ministries). The Call Committee had a Zoom meeting with Pastor Sara on November 18 to learn more about TEEM and to discuss if this would be a viable option for our congregation. If so, we would meet with the congregation before deciding on this alternative.

# CONGREGATIONAL INFORMATION

## Audio/Visual (AV) Committee

An audio/visual (AV) committee was formed to determine how best to leverage the grant our congregation received. Committee members include: Pete Budde, Matt Denman, Stan Elmquist, John Larson, and Lelyn Larson.

To date, the committee has met twice to outline several goals of the project, including:

- Leverage the existing AV equipment we already have
- Improve sound quality of live stream and recorded services
- Display select visual content to the entire congregation in the sanctuary
- Explore range of solutions potentially including mounted cameras, mics, and TV monitors/screens in the sanctuary
- Eliminate waste in printing (hardcopy) materials, e.g., bulletins
- Potentially replace existing speakers (more aesthetic and subtle)
- Add presentation capabilities in the Fellowship Hall

There is progress on receiving bids from a number of vendors to meet the above requirements. All estimates will consider the recurring maintenance & staffing costs in final proposals. Next step, after the holiday season, is to summarize options and present them to the congregation for consideration.

Volunteers are always needed. Volunteers sort clothing, price the clothes, place on the racks, and check out customers at the cash register. Volunteers also receive a discount for clothing purchases when they work.
